A BALMY CBC

The Dec. 18 Christmas Bird Count must have been one of the warmest of the 43 so far held by Evergreen Audubon, with temperatures reaching the mid- to high 50s.

Thirteen expert birders and their volunteer teams fanned out under the guidance of Brad Andres, who will provide a full report in the February *Dipper*. See page 5 for photos.

A cash bar and silent auction will begin at 6 p.m., with the dinner buffet at 7 p.m.

BIRD BUSINESS COMPILED FROM EVERGREENAUDUBON.ORG: LOCAL SIGHTINGS



Bob Santangelo snapped this shot of a Townsend's Solitaire, above, at Marilyn Rhodes' Hiwan bird bath in late November. Sherman Wing photographed a flock of Sandhill Cranes, below, in Delta on Nov. 30.

Brad Andres observed a **Winter Wren** on Nov. 19 along the creek at Dick's Hickory Dock in Kittredge and determined its light throat indicated the eastern Winter Wren that split recently from the West Coast form (Pacific Wren). Also, a **Glaucous Gull** was easily found at Chatfield.

JoAnn Hackos reported on Nov. 23 that for the second day in a row, they had a flock of 11 **Wild Turkeys** at their pond.

On a late-November visit to Evergreen to pick up his EA Christmas wreath at Marilyn Rhodes' house, Bob Santangelo was treated to a visit by a **Townsend's Solitaire** on Marilyn's balcony.

Not very local, but definitely notable, were approximately 150 **Sandhill Cranes** feeding in an old cornfield just north of Delta, Colo. Sherman Wing photographed them on Nov. 30.

Snow and cold temps in early December brought in scads of **Dark-eyed Juncos** to Sherman's Indian Hills feeder. They were mostly **Gray-headed**, a fair number of **Slate-colored** and a few **Oregon** and **Pink-sided**, with one **White-winged**.

Chuck Aid reported on Dec. 6 that two or three **Cassin's Finches** had shown up at his feeders three times this fall (Oct. 25 and 26, and Nov. 18).

Small flocks of **Evening Grosbeaks** (2-8) were regular visitors in August and early September, but then went elsewhere. The cold weather apparently helped bring them back, and 50 were at Chuck's house on Dec. 3.

Chuck added that two **American Three-toed Woodpeckers** were seen at Lair o' the Bear on Nov. 23.

According to Sherman, some of the highlights of the Dec. 18 Denver Field Ornithologists' Christmas Bird Count in Indian Hills were 207 **American Robins**, 103 **Townsend's Solitaires**, one **Great Horned Owl** heard "hooting" during the midmorning, and 34 **Wild Turkeys**.

Join Mike Foster for the third Winter Duck Walk at Prospect Park in Wheat Ridge (aka Wheat Ridge Greenbelt). Previously we've seen nearly 30 species.

The Mandarin Duck was still in residence this past fall. He seems to like it here.

Exit Interstate 70 at Ward Road,

then at the bottom of the ramp turn left (south) on 44th. Turn right into the park between Robb and Quail streets. Meet by the picnic area and bathrooms.
